



3rd GOSPEL chapter 21 vs. 32

In the second essay it was stated that the attack on the world trade center was religiously and politically motivated. But, before that could be understood and before this third essay could be written, a *final* message was needed to prepare humanity for what is coming upon the world. That message is to accept the *one* command so that you will be able to *stand in the presence of the Almighty and the Son of Man*. (St. Luke 21: 36) Also, that message was the main purpose of the second essay. Without that message first being preached, and preached in its historical setting, one will not be prepared to comprehend the misunderstandings, on the part of all humanity, what is about to be disclose in this third essay, and, what the great I AM is about to disclose in history. It is again, a political and religious issue, and without this in mind, it will be misunderstood, again.

In order for one to understand, one must have a general knowledge of the *end* time events written in the book of Daniel chapters and verses 9: 27; 11: 31; 12: 11, and in the book of Romans the whole of chapter 2, particularly verses 28 and 29. These chapters and verses can be found in the Judeo-Christian Bible.

The Book of Daniel is to the Old Testament, as Revelation is to the New Testament. They are prophecy books speaking of future events. In the book of Daniel in chapters and verses 9: 27, 11: 31, and 12: 11 Daniel speaks of an “abomination that causes desolation” on the Jewish Temple that is to take place in his future, but our past, which brings us back to Jesus *before* Christianity and Islam. It is best to refer to the 3rd gospel of St. Luke chapter 21 verse 20, because it specifically states that armies or soldiers will surround Jerusalem to destroy the city and the Temple. That event took place in A. D. 70 just as Jesus stated would happen in his generation, and as clearly written in Luke 21 verse 32. Most Bibles carry this translation of St. Luke.

Jesus was after Daniel and he fulfilled Daniels prophecy and so did Jesus’ *generation*. The destruction of the Temple would not have happened had his generation understood and accepted Jesus’ *one* command, which is “**A new command I give, love one another as I have loved you**”, which can be found in the gospel of John chapter 13 verse 34. Had Jesus’ generation accepted this *one* command, they would have been the *last* generation. For that reason a new prophecy book, which are really seven letters, had to be written such as the Letters of Revelation, with new and *different* prophecies.

Now with this correct understanding of the Abomination that Causes Desolation, which has been misunderstood for two thousand years by humanity, one might begin to comprehend and compare the twofold motivation that led to the attack on the World Trade Center and the purpose of this third essay.

First, the attack's motivation from a *political* standpoint goes back to the British who created the Balfour Declaration announcing support for a national home for the Jewish people, in Palestine. In addition, in the 1940's and 1950's after an ugly war, World War 2 produced many refugees that were left without a home, whom amongst them were people of Jewish decent. The United States and the United Nations aided the Zionist Jews to first negotiate with the Arabs, who were already occupying land that once belonged to the Jews, so that, about 100,000 Jewish Refugees could find a new home. This was done with compassion and with good intent. The world saw the Jews and Arabs as a sort of kin, and thought that they would work things out. But, after negotiations failed war broke out. The Jews fought and regained land, which they haven't had for almost 2,000 years, away from the Arabs who were also unable to defend themselves. The Arabs felt and presently still feel towards the Jews and Americans a lot like what the Americans would feel, if the American Indians would coalesce with the French, British and the Russians to demand its land back, and this only after 200 years.

Second, the attacks motivation from a *religious* point of view begins with the fact that we Americans also have religious interest. The majority of Christian Americans in the 1940's and today, would like to see the Jews back in Palestine to rebuild the Temple, so that, the world armies would surround it and fulfill Daniel's prophecy: The Abomination that causes Desolation. This in turn would initiate the end of the world and Jesus himself would appear in the clouds just as he promised; what follows next is the world would become a less violent place. But, Islam does not see that Christians are only seeking for what Mohamed constantly prayed for. Most Moslems only see a sort of bias likening towards the Jews by predominately Christian America.

Israel/Jews must remember that the Promised Land was not theirs to begin with. They were a people chosen for a message. They did their pilgrimage well and brought humanity to the Promise Land 2,000 years ago, so that the *vertical* God (or better said the *vertical* perception of God) could literally join the human race. If it weren't for them where would humanity be today? Now is the time to share that Promise Land with humanity. The question posed on America and the Jewish people is, can one really win this terrorist war, or, is this war going to destroy the Holy Lands, and maybe eventually our earth?

What happened on September 11, 2001 is a result of the oppression that many Arab people received in the 1950's, and are still enduring. They only want to be heard. And the response that the United States has made would of been taken by any political party, whether Democrat or Republican. For the first time in American history the combined *will* of the people was heard. For it is "We the People" who wanted our aggressive response, and it is "We the People" who are suffering it. There's no one to blame but our selves. We must now learn to forgive ourselves and each other.

Revelation, the prophecy letters after Jesus, does speak of Jesus returning in the clouds to participate in making the earth a *less* violent place. It also speaks of spiritual Jews of the heart and not the physical body (which could be a Moslem, Christian or Hindu) that will be gathered. This concept is best translated in the Bible entitled, "The Living Bible". It is found in the whole of chapter 2 in the book of Romans particularly verses 28 and 29, and also in the book of Galatians chapter 6 verses 15 and 16. It clearly states in verse 28 and 29: "For you are not real Jews just because you were *born* of Jewish parents or because you have gone though the Jewish ceremony of circumcision. No, a *real* Jew is any one whose *heart* is right with God. For God is not looking for those who cut their bodies in actual circumcision, but he is looking for those with changed hearts and minds". It has been a misunderstanding, for Revelation does not speak of a physical Jewish Temple being built again in the future (which is our present day Palestine) but of a *spiritual* Temple.

This brings us back to the first essay. We should all get involved with our nearest agency that enhances our community so that in turn, it will enhance our nation as a whole. And finally, a world full of *unity* of all nations and peoples, with a United Nations Flag that does not *capture* nor *force* to salute with pride, but you stand at ease and *smile*.
