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Revealing All of the Many Antichrists

There are only five instances in which the word “antichrist” appears in the bible. On one occasion, St. John used the plural form of the word. This is contrary to tradition, for tradition uses the singular form for *one* Antichrist who will appear at the end of the world. But, if one would carefully read, in their historical context, all the verses where St. John coins the word “antichrist”, they would realize that there is not just one anti-Christ, but many. They will also realize that he will not appear at the end of the world, for he appeared in St. John’s generation. Please read the following verses:

[“Dear children, this is the last hour; and as you have heard that the antichrist is coming, even *now* many antichrists have come. This is how we know it is the last hour.” (1st John 2: 18) “Who is the liar? It is the man who denies that Jesus is the Christ. Such a man is the antichrist—he denies the Father and the Son.” (1st John 2: 22) “...but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even *now is already* in the world.” (1st John 4: 3) “Many deceivers, who do not acknowledge Jesus Christ as coming in the flesh, have gone out into the world. Any such person is the deceiver and the antichrist.” (2nd John verse 7)]

As we can see, there were many antichrists even back then in St. John’s time. We say “even back then”, because there are many today; in fact, there have always been anti-Christes throughout history. And St. John, stating in 1st John 4: 3, that this is the “spirit” of the antichrist, confirms that the antichrist existed even before Jesus was born, for anyone that is against the principles of love and non-violence has a *bad* spirit, and is therefore, truly not pro-Christ, but anti-Christ. This is the true definition for the expression anti (against) Christ.

Moreover, another tradition is that the “666” individual in Revelation is said to be the *great* awaited Antichrist. But Revelation never uses the word Antichrist. It calls him the “False Prophet”. You can label him an anti-Christ, for he does things contrary to love and non-violence, but he’s not exclusive. And, he should not be confused with “The Man of Lawlessness” in 2 Thessalonians chapter 2, for that’s an *institution*. Please see Doc. # 21. Also, Revelation 19: 20 states that this “False Prophet”, along with the “Beast”, will be captured by Jesus and thrown in the fiery lake of burning sulfur. We have designated this “False Prophet” to be Usama Bin Laden. Once again, notice the word Antichrist is absent. In addition, we have stated in the past that Revelation 17: 12 & 13 states that the 10 horns or 10 commandments, which we believe represents conservatism based on *law* rather than “faith and love”, will give power to the “Beast”, which represents False Christianity of which Bush is its *mouth* for it. Furthermore, when the Beast/False Christianity is captured with the False Prophet/Islam, Revelation 19 verse 20 seems not to mention President Bush, for he is the *mouth* and not the actual Beast. Perhaps President Bush will repent for what he has done and really convert this time. Maybe Usama will repent too, which would make the “False Prophet” really just *false* ideologies such as Islam, which will be unmasked and seen in its true light, and then buried deep in the confines of the human heart. Furthermore, it's time for people to take the blame for their own actions, for we don't blame Usama Bin Laden for knocking down the Twin Towers as much as we blame the nineteen individuals, who actually did. Also, we don't blame President Bush for the innocent lives that he has taken as much as we blame the individuals, who obeyed his orders, rather than obey Jesus, when he said not to use force and violence to make the world better and safer. (Rev.13: 10 & Matt. 26: 52) In our Document #22 we wrote, "... we await the disclosure of the Antichrist/False Prophet hopefully by 06-06-06. As far as we are obligated, we feel that when our banner was literally displayed on 6-09-06, we fulfilled our hopes, in a sense. Jesus' command, which people saw on the banner, were not our words, but Jesus' words. If they don't obey the words and disagree, they disobey and disagree not with us, but with Jesus! And we believe that when one read the words on the banner, one would have looked inside one's self and ask, "Have I loved people?" for in one's own self, is where the disclosure of the anti-Christ begins.

In conclusion, there is a song by Michael Jackson called "The Man in the Mirror". The main lyrics are: "If you want to make the world a better place, start with the man in the Mirror." We say to our readers, if you really want to reveal to others, who the true Antichrist is, show them a mirror...but use it first.

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
